

“New” Temporary Medical Licensure does not go into effect until July 1, 2017

The Interstate Medical Compact Bill, HB 2502, passed and signed by Governor Doug Ducey on May 11, 2016 has a provision in it for a new type of medical licensure in Arizona, the temporary license. ARS § 32-1438 provides the Board another licensing option for physicians not licensed to practice in this state. Pursuant to the new law, the Board may issue a temporary license which may not be renewed or extended, to allow a physician who is not a licensee to practice in this state for a total of up to two hundred fifty (250) consecutive days if the physician meets all of the statutes requirements.
