

1 adequate records into the system. His privileges for admitting were
2 reinstated on 3/2/00.

3 5. Dr. Parise was also suspended during the period May 3 through May 23,
4 2000, for the same reason. No patient harm was involved in any of the
5 recordkeeping situations. However, the hospital started keeping track
6 after March 1, relative to the number of days that people had been
7 suspended, rather than the actual number of suspensions.

8 6. Dr. Parise was suspended on seven separate occasions within a one-
9 year period for the same problem.

10 CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

- 11 1. The Board possesses jurisdiction over the subject matter hereof and
12 over Dr. Parise pursuant to A.R.S. § 32-1401 *et seq.*
- 13 2. The conduct and circumstances described above in paragraphs 3
14 through 6 constitute unprofessional conduct pursuant to A.R.S. § 32-
15 1401(25)(e) (Failing or refusing to maintain adequate records on a
16 patient).

17 ORDER

18 Based on the foregoing Findings of Fact and Conclusions of Law,

19 IT IS HEREBY ORDERED THAT:

- 20 1. A letter of reprimand be issued to Dr. Parise for the aforementioned
21 unprofessional conduct;
- 22 2. Dr. Parise be placed on probation for a period of six (6) months, wherein Dr.
23 Parise shall be required to visit Boswell Hospital Medical Records Department not less
24 than two times per month within the six month period;
